

Sandra Shafer is the Director of Choirs at her alma mater Apopka High School and has twice been named "Teacher of the Year" at Liberty Middle School (2014) and Apopka High School (2022). Student choirs under her direction have consistently received Superior Ratings at District Music Performance Assessment as well as toured throughout the United States. Most recently, Apopka High School's Treble Choir "Belles" was invited to perform at the 2021 Florida Conference of the American Choral Directors Association.

As a performer, Mrs. Shafer serves as section leader and soloist at Winter Park Presbyterian Church and sings

with the Orlando Sings Symphonic Chorus and Solaria Singers. She is an active conductor, clinician and adjudicator throughout Florida, and has presented sessions at conferences of the Florida Music Educators Association and the Florida Vocal Association. Mrs. Shafer serves as the social media chair for both FL ACDA and Southern ACDA and is an active member of ACDA, FMEA and FVA. Mrs. Shafer holds a bachelor's degree in Vocal Music Education from Stetson University in DeLand, FL.

FEATURED CONDUCTOR ORLANDO SINGS SYMPHONIC CHORUS



Justin Chase is in his 25th year of teaching. He is currently the choral director at Lake Nona High School in Orlando, Florida, where he was the 2019 – 2020 Lake Nona High School Teacher of the Year. Previously, Mr. Chase taught at University High School in Orlando, Florida, where he was the 2005– 2006 University High School Teacher of the Year. He holds a Bachelor of Music Education degree from the Florida State University and a Master's degree in Music Education from the University of Central Florida. He was the winner of the 2008 Grand Bohemian Excellence in Arts Education Award. High school choirs under his direction have performed

three times for the Florida American Choral Directors Association Conference, twice at the President's Concert for the Florida Music Educators Association, and sang the prelude to an Evensong Service at the Washington D.C. National Cathedral in February of 2020. As musical director for Lake Nona High School's theatre program he has won Applause Awards from the Dr. Phillips Center for Outstanding Musical Director for Lake Nona's productions of Something Rotten, The Sound of Music, West Side Story, Hairspray, In the Heights, and Aida. For the past ten years Mr. Chase has also been the Director of Music at Winter Park Presbyterian Church.

SPECIAL GUEST ARTIST



Bruce Neswick is the Assisting Musician at St. James by-the-Sea Episcopal Church in La Jolla, CA, a position to which he was appointed in summer 2022. Prior to moving to California, he served as the Canon for Music at Trinity Episcopal Cathedral in Portland, OR, Associate Professor of Music in Organ at Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music, and Assistant Organist of St. Francis in the Fields Episcopal Church, Louisville, KY. He has also served as the Director of Music at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine in New York City, and as Canon for Music at the Cathedral of St. Philip, Atlanta.

Active in the field of church music, Mr. Neswick holds the Fellowship degree from the Royal School of Church Music, for whom he has conducted several courses for boy and girl choristers. He has served on the faculties of and performed for several church music conferences, including Master Schola, the Mississippi Conference, the Association of Anglican Musicians, Westminster Choir College Summer Session, the Montreat and Westminster Conferences of the Presbyterian Association of Musicians, the Disciples of Christ Musicians Association, the Conference of Lutheran Church Musicians, the Sewanee Church Music Conference, Organ Alive!, the Shenandoah Conservatory Church Music Institute, and the Evergreen Conference. In recent years, he has performed at St. Florian Abbey, in Austria, as part of the annual BrucknerFest; at the Eastman Rochester Organ Initiative conference; and at the Yale Organ Week.

Mr. Neswick has been commissioned to compose for dozens of performers and churches throughout the United States, and his organ and choral music is published by Paraclete, Augsburg-Fortress, Selah, Vivace, Hope, Plymouth, and St. James Press. Mr. Neswick's skill at improvisation garnered him three first prizes from the 1989 San Anselmo Organ Festival; the 1990 American Guild of Organists' national convention in Boston; and the 1992 Rochette Concours at the Conservatoire de Musique in Geneva, Switzerland.

A graduate of Pacific Lutheran University and of the Yale School of Music and Institute of Sacred Music, Mr. Neswick's teachers have included Robert Baker, David Dahl, Gerre Hancock, Margaret Irwin-Brandon and Lionel Rogg. A Fellow of the American Guild of Organists, Mr. Neswick has served the Guild in many capacities, including chapter dean, regional convention chair, regional education coordinator, member of the national nominating committee, and member of the national improvisation competition committee. Mr. Neswick was awarded an honorary doctorate in 2016 from the University of the South, Sewanee, Tennessee.

As a recitalist, Mr. Neswick has performed extensively throughout the United States and Europe and has been a frequent performer at national and regional conventions of the American Guild of Organists. In 1994, he played the opening convocation for the national AGO convention held in Dallas, Texas, and he was a featured artist and clinician at the national AGO conventions in Seattle (in 2000 and 2022), Washington, DC (in 2010) and Boston (in 2014).
